

Common Injuries Leading to Personal Injury Claims

For anyone injured in an auto accident, the first order of business is to receive medical treatment. Filing a police report is another important step in the process, especially if the victim is considering pursuing an accident injury claim.

If such a claim is filed, proof is needed the driver of the other vehicle is at fault for the accident. In many of these car accident injury claim cases, the police report is considered the main piece of evidence in determining whether negligence was committed on the part of the defendant.

The extent and type of injuries suffered by victims of car accidents depends on the angle of impact, speed of the opposing vehicle and a number of other factors. The most common types of auto accident injuries are whiplash, head injuries and back injuries.

Whiplash

Caused by a quick backwards snap or jerk of the head, whiplash is the most common occurring auto injury, especially when victims are struck from behind. This injury often causes distress to the soft tissue of the tendons, muscles and ligaments in the neck, causing severe and immediate long-lasting pain.

Head Injuries

Part of the reason head injuries are so common is due to the violent bouncing the body experiences from the impact of the collision. This bouncing makes the head vulnerable to suffering injury from any protrusion or surface nearby, including side windows, the ceiling interior and the steering wheel.

Back Injuries

An extremely sensitive part of the body, the spine is highly susceptible to trauma from sudden impact. However, the particulars of a back injury are sometimes difficult to pinpoint. Unless the specifics of the injury are immediately evident, it might take some time for physicians to confidently determine the location and extent of the damage.

For car accident victims with injuries such as the one described above, proving negligence on the part of the responsible party is vital to winning an injury claim. In order to be awarded a settlement, having a police report that can confirm such negligence is of the utmost importance.
