Lawyers Face a Wide Variety of Scenarios

These experts come in the form of physicians which, in some states, must submit an “affidavit of merit” attesting to the legitimacy of a particular claim.

There are also statute of limitations issues to consider in some cases where a medical condition resulting from the negligence of a healthcare professional might not surface until long after the treatment has been performed. This is another circumstance in which a [personal injury lawyer](#) or malpractice attorney may need to enlist the help of an expert witness. Some law firms will even have board certified doctors on staff available to offer assistance when needed.

A malpractice lawyer must also be prepared to deal with insurance companies that will aggressively support the defendant.
